PhD 'The Post Crisis Administration of Nestor Kirchner: Continuity and Change in the Political Economy of Argentina' 2005-2010
University of Leeds (ESRC 1+3 Scholarship Award)

My thesis investigated the impact of the 2001 Tango Crisis on Argentine political economy, and its development trajectory. Starting from an analysis of the crisis itself, and its causes, the thesis moved on to analyse the post-crisis regime of Néstor Kirchner. Based on both document research and qualitative data collection in the field, the thesis identified sources of continuity and change in Argentine political economy after the crisis in order to develop an understanding of the changing nature of the Peronist social contract in Argentina.
