RESEARCH and TEACHING

Since my undergraduate studies I have been interested in analysing problems of rural development in the Third World, with particular reference to Latin America. I have done research work in Chile, Peru, Cuba, Bolivia, Honduras and Nicaragua. The main focus of my research has been on agrarian change, rural livelihoods, farming systems, land reform, peasant movements, and on historical comparative analyses of the European and Latin American rural economy and society.

I also have a long-standing commitment to development studies as an interdisciplinary field of teaching, research and policy. I have lectured in several master and PhD programmes in the University of Glasgow, Catholic University of Peru in Lima, International Institute of Social Studies in The Hague, The Netherlands, University of Colombo in Sri Lanka, University of Lleida in Spain and the Faculty of Latin American Social Sciences (FLACSO) in Quito, Ecuador, among others. Thus I have done research on the development of development theory and historical aspects of development studies with particular reference to Latin America.

I have been teaching several courses on rural development and on development theory and policy since my first lecturing appointment. I have supervised over one hundred MA students for their dissertations as well as several Ph.D. students.
